DEVELOPING SENSES-KNOWING BEYOND BOOKS
Activities to be played in the classroom for intellectual development (sense training) and reading readiness. A) LISTENING
Take a familiar object e.g. a bunch of keys, without children seeing it. Rattle the keys and then
ask children to recognize the sound. In this way many other things that produce distinct sounds
may be used; a small bell, a big bell, etc.
B) TOUCH & SENSE THE STEREOGNOSIS BAG
Put some familiar objects in a cloth bag and close the bag. Be sure children do not see you
putting the objects in the bag. Ask children to close their eyes, let them feel the bag nicely with
their fingers and recognize the objects.
To start with just a small plastic ball may be used. Pencil, rubber, different vegetables like
carrot, turnip, an apple or an orange can be used.
c) <u>SMELL, FEEL &amp; TOUCH</u>
Introduce the children to a few things with a distinct smell e.g. rose, onion, soap, etc.
Cover one of the objects with a cloth, be sure the child does not see you covering the object -
let the child smell and recognize the object.
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Fruits like an apple or a banana may be covered and the child with the eyes closed or blind folded may touch and smell and recognize the object.

# D) TASTE & FLAVOURS

After children are introduced to different tastes e.g. sweet, sour, bitter, hot (chilli), salty, give the child one object (only one at a time), to taste and identify.

# E) PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT
